do's

Here are a few legitimate reasons you might gift assets:

- Divide your assets early to stop any family issues
- Help a family member out with a purchase of a home or to start a business
- S Thank an individual for supporting you and having a strong contribution to your life
- Maintaining your property may become difficult therefore you want someone else to be responsible for it

*These gifts still need to be made in the correct way and documented.

don'ts

- If you intend on receiving the money or assets back
- S When you're already ill
- S You already have plan to go into care
